3RD GRADERS ATTEND CLASS AT ALPHA SCHOOL SPEND ENTIRE SCHOOLDAY AT THE MUSEUM

On November 21, two classes of 3rd graders from Crescent Elementary arrived for a day long field trip at Frontier Country Museum. Students and teachers came prepared to experience history by dressing in pioneer style clothing, bringing their lunches in tin pails and using tin cans for their drinks

One class of students spent the morning in the one room schoolhouse with lessons by teacher Mary Ann Beeby. She used curriculum from the 1930's which included lessons in reading, writing and arithmetic. In addition to practicing such things as penmanship and spelling, they learned the lessons of the harsh discipline that

unruly students received 'back in the day'.

Writing with nib and ink made practicing their writing a unique and interesting way to complete their lessons.

Attending class in the old schoolhouse made learning about life in the 'classroom of days gone by' an experience they will long remember.

The rest of the students were divided into two groups with one group touring the museum while the others spent some time in the church fellowship hall learning a little history of the time and trying their hand at embroidery. Each student was given a hoop, needle,

thread and a cloth with a pattern to embroider. They seemed to enjoy trying this new skill and only one or two sewed their work to their shirt.

They rotated during their session so each of these groups had a chance to tour the museum and try their hand with a needle.

After lunch and some frontier games, the classes switched places so everyone enjoyed all the experiences the museum had to offer.

We look forward to having the students return in April of 2015 for Frontier Day at the Museum.




With free admission throughout the month December, it is a great time to stop in to check out the little town and to tour the museum.
